Introduction

- Walking and worshipping
- God saved all of *you*

Worship is... a response to God

- The gospel compels us to worship (“Therefore, I urge you...”)
- The response must be willing

Worship is... a real life response to God

- Christ was the sacrifice for sin
- We offer ‘thank offerings’ (Leviticus 7:11-14)
 - Our bodies/lives
- Our sacrifice should be *holy* and *pleasing to God*

Worship is... a rational real life response to God

- “This is your spiritual/rational *worship*”
- Christian living is the logical consequence of the gospel

Conclusions

- How can I worship God at home, at school, at work, in my marriage?
- The gospel affects the entire life
- Worship is not just for Sunday services!
- Most people live to worship themselves
 - Christians live to worship God
- Christian living is motivated by God’s grace and God’s glory.

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Leviticus 7:11-14

11 “ ‘These are the regulations for the fellowship offering a person may present to the Lord: 12 “ ‘If he offers it as an expression of thankfulness, then along with this thank offering he is to offer cakes of bread made without yeast and mixed with oil, wafers made without yeast and spread with oil, and cakes of fine flour well-kneaded and mixed with oil.13 Along with his fellowship offering of thanksgiving he is to present an offering with cakes of bread made with yeast.14 He is to bring one of each kind as an offering, a contribution to the Lord; it belongs to the priest who sprinkles the blood of the fellowship offerings.

Leviticus 22:21

When anyone brings from the herd or flock a fellowship offering to the Lord to fulfill a special vow or as a freewill offering, it must be without defect or blemish to be acceptable

Numbers 15:3

...present to the Lord offerings made by fire, from the herd or the flock, as an aroma pleasing to the Lord—whether burnt offerings or sacrifices...
